909.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved.

The Clerk contacted the public footpaths department at NYCC concerning the deterioration of the snicket who instructed her to submit a form with photos. The Council is still waiting for the NYCC to respond.

#### 909.4 Budget

The Council considered the possibility of having a bus shelter at the bus stop near the garage travelling towards Kirkbymoorside. The Clerk contacted highways to inquire about the feasibility of this project and what type of bus shelter we could have and also would it be possible to move the bus stop to Colley Pond.

The Clerk was asked to find out the requirements regarding raised/lowered footpaths at the bus stop, and to get a rough quote as to the overall cost of having this sited at Colley Pond with the necessary adjustments to pavements etc. Councillor Edwards agreed to give a quote on the job.

#### 909.5 Mobile Mast

A request was received for siting a mobile mast on land owned by NPC- Marr Pond or The Quarry

The company are interested in the land that is on offer and want to set up a multi site meeting with the Council. The Clerk sent a letter of endorsement to the company. The company raised its offer to £32,500. There is a private landowner interested in this offer as well as the Council.

912.5 It was brought to the attention of the Council that the school buses, Perrys coaches, were knocking the pupils walking down the road with the wing mirrors. This is unacceptable and the Clerk was asked to invite the headteacher Mr Mc Candless to the next meeting to discuss possible solutions.

9.12.6 The Clerk was asked to enquire about the possibilities of flashing lights, zebra crossing or some other way of crossing the road to school. The Clerk to look into the dropped kerb we asked for several months ago.
