20 Minutes of council meeting of 19th February 2018

22 Actions from the last meeting

22.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved.

22.2 Monthly inspection of Council owned land

22.3 Budget Bus Shelter, VAS sign

The Council has researched the possibility of purchasing a VAS sign. This would need approximately £2,650.

The Clerk has completed a survey regarding VAS and SID. The survey asked whether The Council would consider purchasing a VAS or SID and whether we would be prepared to move the sign when asked to rotate and undergo training to do this. The Council would prefer not to rotate the sign as the VAS or SID that would be suitable would inform drivers of their speed.

The Clerk was asked to contact the Legal Officer at NYCC to sort out the problem of the state of School Lane.

There has been no update on this so Cllr Windress asked The Clerk to arrange a meeting at the school asap.
