58 Agenda

59 Parishioner presentation

There had been a complaint that the hounds of Sinnington Hunt were being exercised in the village early in the morning. It was agreed that The Chair would speak to the hunt staff and make them aware of the complaint.

There had been a verbal agreement in 1998 that hounds would not come through the village.

62 Actions from the last meeting

62.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved.

62.2 Monthly inspection of Council owned land

62.3 VAS Sign

The Members on the review group met in June and have agreed to recommend that the County Council changes its policy to allow parishes to purchase and maintain a Vehicle Activated Sign. The task group is in the process of finalising a report to go to the Committee meeting on 12 July 2018. Subject to the deliberations at that meeting the

report with recommendations will go to the Executive for approval. The Council is awaiting their decision. The Council to revisit this when information is updated.

62.4 Kissing Gates

The Clerk was asked to look into the replacement of kissing gates from Gale Lane across the footpath to near Calverts carpets. The Clerk still has had no reply. The Clerk has spoken to the owner who is happy to get this sorted.

62.5 Dog Fouling

There has been a complaint about dog fouling along Highfield Road on the pavement. It was suggested that the dog bin on Highfield Lane was moved down opposite Kirkdale Manor. The Clerk was given permission by the headmistress of Nawton School to place a dog bin along the snicket. The Clerk ordered a new bin and Cllr Jackson installed it.

62.6 Footpaths

The Clerk informed highways that the path running from Beckett Wood to Guncroft Lane is narrowing because of the grass covering the footpath and making it difficult for people with pushchairs to walk along it. Also the path on the opposite side to Beckett Recreation Ground is narrowing. The grass has been trimmed back.

62.7 The fence along the side of footpath leading to Howl lane is falling down and is hazardous to the public because of rusty nails and barbed wire falling towards the narrow path. Cllr Swift will contact the owner to get it repaired.

65.1 The Clerk was contacted by a parishioner who was concerned about the state of a tree at the back of his property. The Clerk asked Oliver of Bilsdale tree services to inspect the trees all along the verge in front of The Sidings. He advised to remove the tree as he considered it dangerous A second opinion was sought and the tree was deemed hazardous because of rot all down he trunk and arrangements have been made to fell the tree.

63.2 The Clerk received a letter from a concerned parishioner to bring attention to the Cllrs, about the government proposal that would allow exploratory drilling for shale gas to be considered as permitted development and also the proposal to class fracking as a NSIP which means only government can decide. If passed the industry would need no planning permission. She has contacted all town and Parish Councils to ask for support in opposing this proposal by sending a submission to the government's consultation which runs until the 25th October and writing to ministers. The Clerk was asked to draft a letter to oppose the proposal of PD and Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project
