78 Actions from the last meeting

78.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved.

78.4 Kissing Gates

78.5 Fence along Footpath

The fence along the side of footpath leading to Howl lane is falling down and is hazardous to the public because of rusty nails and barbed wire falling towards the narrow path. The owner has said he would have a look at it.

78.6 Field Maple

The tree by The Sidings has now been removed. The Clerk has been asked by a parishioner to replace the tree. Bilsdale services advised that a white cherry would be appropriate. Councillors discussed the possibility of having a Christmas tree with lights. The Clerk was asked to contact Bilsdale to see whether the stump needs grinding down.

78.7 Streetlight

A streetlight in Station Road is not working and also on Howldale Lane. Both of these have been reported.

78.8 Waste bin

An overflowing waste bin on the corner of High Street has been reported to Streetscene and has been dealt with.

78.9 Donations

The cricket club is asking for donations towards the cost of a new electronic scoreboard and weather equipment. The Council asked The Clerk to find out how the £28,000 that was left to the Beckett Recreation Ground was going to be split between the various interested parties. The trustees reported that a meeting will be held in January to discuss the fund; she said that some of the money will be held in the bank account for future needs. The remaining money would be split between the users of the recreation ground. They were looking at drainage and had been quoted £16,000.
