86.4 Kissing Gates

The Clerk was asked to look into the replacement of kissing gates from Gale Lane across the footpath to near Calverts carpets The Clerk received an email from NYCC .See below:

I write to inform you that, following a recent request from the landowner's agent, I have made a site visit regarding replacing these 2 gates. The gates are the responsibility of the landowner and, on behalf of NYCC Public Rights of Way, I have contacted the land agent and offered to provide new gates for the landowner to install, or, if required, for NYCC to install 2 new gates if the landowner pays for the materials. The land agent is going to speak with the landowner and then come back to me. I will update you again once I know what the next stage is.

I've copied my colleague Rosie Sanderson into this e-mail, as Rosie was the last person from NYCC Public Rights of Way who was in contact with you regarding this matter.

I apologise for the fact this issue has been "going on" for years rather than months, but hopefully it will be sorted as soon as possible now.

86.5 Fence along Footpath

The fence along the side of footpath leading to Howl lane is falling down and is hazardous to the public because of rusty nails and barbed wire falling towards the narrow path. The owner has said he would have a look at it. The Chair will talk to the owner.
