110 Actions from the last meeting

110.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved.

110.2 Monthly inspection of Council owned land
All Council Land was inspected.

110.3 VAS Sign

The scheme is due to be up and running from April 2019. However, the process involved is still to be approved by members of the executive group. This is scheduled to take place next month.

110.4 Accident on High Street

Following on from a report last month of an incident where a man narrowly missed being hit by a car turning on to High Street and whose dog was hit and needed veterinary care, The Clerk received the reply below from highways:

Due to budget cuts, the County Council is now working under significantly reduced funding for highway improvement works. As a result of these constraints the County Council targets any funding that is still available towards those measures that we believe will achieve casualty reduction benefits. The Local Highway Authority implements a rolling programme of Local Safety Schemes designed to reduce the number of casualties on the County's roads often through the introduction of measures designed to reduce vehicle speeds. Collision cluster sites (four personal injury collisions in the last three years within a set search radius) and routes of concern are highlighted for investigation and where necessary engineering remedial measures are implemented to address the collision pattern. Sites with a higher number of collisions are prioritised but if the appropriate solution at a problematic site is beyond the budget available the scheme will be added to the County Councils reserve list for potential funding in the future. In terms of this section of the A170 our records show there has been only 1 personal injury accident in the last 5 years and as such is not presently a location which would be identified as requiring an intervention.

110.5 Kissing Gates

Mr Simpson is still communicating with NYCC about size etc. He did state that he thinks the cost of the gate between the fields should have been shared between owners.

110.6 Re-locate Electric substation

Mr Larry Carr emailed the plans and information from the designer. The Council agreed the plans and instructed The Clerk to give permission to Northern Powergrid to proceed. The Council are waiting for their lawyer to draw up the plans.

110.7 Tree over snicket

The Clerk contacted the school to suggest they discuss the problem with Mr & Mrs Butcher as it is not the property of The Council.

110.8 Grit bin

Phil Capstick gave his permission to The Council to place the grit bin in his yard. He mentioned that there were still two bags of grit left from several years ago and that could be put in the bin or used up when the conditions were icy.
