214 Actions from the last meeting

214.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved by the Chair. **This will be signed at a later date.**

214.2 Monthly inspection of Council owned land

214.3 VAS Sign

The Clerk has received two quotations for the VAS sign. Please see emails.

The Councillors agreed to go with TWM as this was the best price. The Clerk was instructed to confirm with the company. It is expected to take 6 weeks before the sign is erected.

214.4 Draft contract re electric sub station

The Clerk received the draft contract which was sent to the solicitor from NPG. The Council agreed that the recommendations from our solicitor should be adhered to and the clauses remain, and that she should contact NPG to emphasise that the contract stands as is. The solicitor has received the document back from NPG and is giving it her attention

214.6 Covid-19

Several parishioners have asked what the Council is doing about this emergency. There are people who want to help. The Councillors advised putting a poster on the village board and something on the website.

214.7 Football pitch at Ryedale School

The Council wanted to know why we weren't consulted on this. There was concern that the 8 lights would be a nuisance to the village and nearby residents. They were also concerned that the placement would interfere with any future plans for a new entrance for cars and coaches at the rear of Birklands. The Clerk sent the Council's objections to RDC who said they would pass on our comments to NYCC. Looking at the website, this does not seem to be the case.

214.8 Litter in lay-by

There is a problem of litter being dropped in the layby where the school buses park. The Clerk was asked to contact Perry's coaches to make them aware of the problem. The Clerk received a reply from Perry's Coaches explaining that they were very upset about this and their drivers always take their rubbish home but as a good will gesture they decided to do a litter pick.
