344 Minutes of council meeting of 20th September 2021

345 Code of Conduct and the Ethical Framework

346 Actions from the last meeting

346.1 The Clerk's timesheet was approved and signed by the Chair.

346.2 Monthly inspection of Council owned land

All Council Land was inspected. Form filled in and weather conditions taken into account. Weather conditions for October were warm with little rain. The tree inspection has been completed and the Council is waiting for the report from Joe Waites.

346.3 Signing of Climate and Environment Emergency Declaration

A vote was taken and the results were 2 For and 5 Against.

The Council have informed The Environment Group that they will debate any future proposals from the Community Group and give support if it is considered appropriate.

346.4 Streetlights

The streetlights in School Lane were not coming on at the right time. The Clerk has reported the issue to NYCC. This seems to be working correctly now

346.5 Bank charges

The clerk received a letter from HSBC stating that our account would be subjected to bank charges- £8 per month, £1.00 per cheque, £1.50 per credit cheque. The Clerk has asked advice on the SLCC site and other councils seem happy with Unity Trust.

It was suggested that instead of using cheques,, The Council could use BACS payments and online banking.

346.6 Trimming of trees on the A170

A request was received to trim back the trees on the A170 to provide a clearer view when turning right from Station Road on large farming vehicles. The Councillors decided that this was not needed as farming vehicles hardly ever go down Station Road and that lorries to and from Calverts don't have a problem

346.7 Salary review

The Clerk is currently on £11.19ph and should be on £14.02. NYCC guidance states PC pay scale is point 22. The Council agreed to raise the Clerks salary to £14.02p

346.8

Following a parishioner presentation at the September meeting, the council were asked if they would like feedback of the village survey at the October meeting. This was agreed for the meeting on the 18 October.

The Results from the survey will be published in due course when the results are analysed.

346.8 20's Plenty

A nearly universal aspiration in communities is to make traffic speed compatible with community life and human survivability. A 30mph limit is no longer fit for purpose for urban and village streets. Lower default limits are being set. Choose 20mph. Local Councillors and Police and Crime Commissioner often say that their most common public complaint is "traffic speed". Many local and national governments are replacing 30mph with 20mph on most roads. 21 million people now live in places where parties from across the political spectrum agree that 20's Plenty where people live, work, play, learn and shop.

This was not supported by The Council as it would be difficult to achieve on the A170 but could be actioned on the roads leading to the schools.
